University Status Requires a Dedicated Research Center

In 2009, Maryland University of Integrative Health decided to embark upon an ambitious plan to significantly expand academic offerings, attract and retain the best and most talented faculty, and achieve university status. By the end of 2013, we had achieved each of these goals. In just four years, our academic programming has grown from four degrees and certificate programs to 18, and enrollment has nearly doubled to 800 graduate students. Also in 2013, we earned university status, making MUIH the only regionally-accredited university on the East Coast exclusively dedicated to integrative health and natural wellness.

As we look to 2015 and beyond, we have plans to continue expanding our academic offerings as well as increasing our graduate student enrollment. In order to maintain a competitive edge with other universities with programs similar to ours, MUIH must develop a dedicated research center to guide our research agenda, build partnerships with experienced research institutions, and support faculty in research development and implementation.

MUIH has achieved a position of respect and high regard in the field of integrative health education and practice. The next step to anchoring this standing is to build a research publication record. We must boldly move forward in the field of research as we have done with our academic programs.

MUIH Uniquely Equipped to Research 21st Century Health Care Challenges

A new model of health care is emerging – one that is individualized, innovative, and intimate. Bolstered by the Affordable Care Act, healthcare systems are striving to improve patient experience and satisfaction, improve population health, and reduce costs. - The impact of healing presence on whole-person, patient-centered outcomes and overall patient

- experience of and satisfaction with healthcare
- The impact of multidisciplinary integrative health teams on whole-person, patient-centered outcomes and healthcare costs
- The impact of teaching patients self-care practices including healthy cooking, yoga, and mindfulness practices on whole-person, patient-centered outcomes and healthcare costs

The field of integrative health is often viewed with skepticism and uncertainty even as it moves into the mainstream. MUIH is in an enviable position to conduct quality research and partner with others to dispel myths, build credibility, and demonstrate the efficacy and specific outcomes of this medicine.

In addition, research conducted at MUIH will impact the broader research community who are eager for more evidence that supports integrative health disciplines and philosophies.
