“Water’s Edge”

LAUREL, MD – “Water’s Edge” features photographs by Maryland artist Meryl Silver and opens Friday, September 16, in the Himmelfarb Gallery at Maryland University of Integrative Health (MUIH). A reception for the artist will be held on Tuesday, September 20 from 5:00 – 7:00 pm.

In “Water’s Edge,” the photographer’s goal is to capture the beautiful effects of light, pattern, reflection, shadow, and atmospheric events on the natural landscape. Silver says, “Over time, I’ve become increasingly fascinated by the ephemeral moments produced by the interplay of light, fog, and water movement with the permanent fixtures, such as rocks, mountains, shoreline, and bridges.”

From this project evolved another group of images, which are also included in this exhibit. Images that Silver calls Sea Etchings were also taken at water’s edge. These images in the sand chronicle an even more ephemeral existence. Like sand castles, the etchings change with each wave and ultimately disappear forever as the tide rolls in. Their very existence is recorded only through the instantaneous photographic image.
